



Summary OF LOCAL RULES

OUT OF BOUNDS:

Beyond any boundary wall and foreshore fence. Clubhouse and enclosure defined by kerbstones. Tunnel defined by grid on either side. Beyond any demarcation lines to left and back of 1st, left of the 4th to include the Short Game Practice Area and left of 7th. A ball crossing any public road and coming to rest in another part of the course. Carpark extending to and including all machinery and course service areas to the rear and side of 10th tee box, including concrete slab.

INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE:

Bridges, all boundary walls, fences, white stakes defining all out of bounds, rocks not in closely mown areas.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 25.1):

G.U. R. is ringed with a white line. A player must drop from G.U.R.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 24.2):

Pumphouse, seats, bins, irrigation equipment, distance markers on the tees, embedded rocks in closely mown areas, fence around water hole between 9th and 18th, all paths and roads, practice mats on practice area, sleeper steps, tee markers on the tee box, staked trees, "disc" distance markers on fairways and directional pole at back of 15th Green

MOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 24.1):

Stones in bunkers, rakes, hazard stakes, distance markers & wire hoops & stays.

WATER HAZARDS:

Relief from the water hazard on the left of the 2nd must be taken in the dropping area provided.

PRACTICE GROUND:

Deemed a closely mown area.

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES:

Allowed providing they conform to R&A Regulations

TEAM OF 4 COMPETITIONS:

Max. Allowed Handicaps are 22 for Men / 28 for Ladies

BALL MOVING ON THE GREEN

"Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows:

When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment.

The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1.

This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental. **Note:** If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.
